

RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS; MINUTES OF THE VILLAGE OF LEWISBURG, OHIO REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING AT 7:30 P.M., OCTOBER 4, 2016 AT THE FIREHOUSE.

The regular meeting of the Village of Lewisburg, Ohio Council was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by President Marsha Jones.

ROLL CALL: Kim Cahill, Clerk of Council.

PRESENT: Council Members Belinda Harry, Mark Madigan, Jackie Sewert, Marsha Jones, and Donald Wright. Mayor Pat Putnam and Dennis Roberts were absent. Also present were Municipal Manager Jeff Sewert, Law Director Rick Faber, Fire Chief Bob Sewert, and Police Chief Rick McGee.

Motion to approve the minutes of the September 15, 2016 regular Village Council Meeting. First by Donald Wright. Second by Belinda Harry. Roll Call vote: 5 Yes 0 No. Motion approved.

CITIZENS: Paul Nabel V was introduced by Chief McGee, who recommended that he be hired as a part-time police officer for the Village. Motion to hire Paul Nabel V as a part-time police officer. First by Donald Wright. Second by Belinda Harry. Roll Call vote: 5 Yes 0 No. Motion approved. Mr. Nabel was then sworn in by Mr. Faber.

MAYOR: Mrs. Jones addressed the sample ordinances passed out regarding livestock/animals for all to review and advised that the issue would be addressed at the next council meeting.

LEGAL: None.

MUNICIPAL MANAGER: The fall edition of the newsletter will be going out next week.

Turned over discussion to Chief Sewert, who reported that there will be a Fire Prevention open house on Sunday, October 16, from 1 p.m. to 3 p.m. at the firehouse. There will also be a blood drive on Monday, October 24, from 3 p.m. to 7 p.m. at the Community Center.

Chief Sewert also mentioned that all seven of the Village employees participating in the firefighter training have passed the state test for Level 1 firefighters. Several have been on calls already. They are ready to go and we are grateful for that. Cody Burnside is also involved with this program.

Addressed the ODOT letter that was in the council packets. Attended the Rural Consultation meeting on September 28 and learned that State Route 503 through town will be paved in either 2018 or 2019.

Addressed the Ohio Municipal League Conference materials that were in council's packets for their information.

Turned over discussion to Chief McGee, who addressed the parade route request forms that were in council's packets. He talked about the three different routes and that these forms would be used going forward to present to council for approval of routes.

Chief McGee also addressed a proposed Senior Watch Program. He described the program and reviewed the materials included in council's packets. He recommended that council approve the program. Motion to approve the Senior Watch Program. First by Donald Wright. Second by Belinda Harry. Roll Call vote: 5 Yes 0 No. Motion approved.

SAFETY: Presented the resignation of Tyler McIntosh and recommended it be accepted. Motion to accept the resignation of Tyler McIntosh. First by Donald Wright. Second by Mark Madigan. Roll Call vote: 5 Yes 0 No. Motion approved.

POLICE: Distributed the monthly report.

LIBRARY: None.

PARK: The Park Board met on September 19.

The trees are coming down for the stream bank project.

We are still waiting on news regarding the sealant on the walking trails.

The spray park has been turned off and is winterized.

Leaf pick up starts October 17.

OLD BUSINESS: Mr. Sewert reported that he will be meeting with Leery tomorrow regarding repairs to the water tower that Leery will be doing. Will have an update at the next council meeting.

NEW BUSINESS: None.

MISC. BUSINESS: Mr. Madigan reminded everyone of Bingo on October 15 at 6:00 p.m. at the Community Center.

Mr. Wright suggested that the Ways and Means Committee look into reducing the number of part-time police officers in the Village and hire more full-time officers instead.
