

RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS; MINUTES OF THE VILLAGE OF LEWISBURG, OHIO REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING AT 7:30 P.M., JUNE 1, 2017 AT THE FIREHOUSE.

The regular meeting of the Village of Lewisburg, Ohio Council was called to order at 7:30 p.m. by Mayor Pat Putnam.

ROLL CALL: Kim Cahill, Clerk of Council.

PRESENT: Council Members Belinda Harry, Mark Madigan, Marsha Jones, and Chad Woodworth. Dennis Roberts and Jackie Sewert were absent. Also present were Municipal Manager Jeff Sewert, Law Director Rick Faber, Fire Chief Bob Sewert, and Police Chief Rick McGee.

Motion to approve the minutes of the May 18, 2017 regular Village Council Meeting. First by Mark Madigan. Second by Chad Woodworth. Roll Call vote: 5 Yes 0 No. Motion approved.

CITIZENS: None.

MAYOR: Read a thank you note from the school for opening the spray park for their Book Walk. Thanks to the Village for its support. Manager Sewert stated that we have the nicest park in the county.

Chief Sewert awarded Sara Harris the Simone Hobbs Scholarship and presented her with a check in the amount of \$500. He stated that this scholarship has been awarded since 1986 and this year was the best group of applicants ever. Sara will be attending Ball State University in the fall majoring in Nursing.
